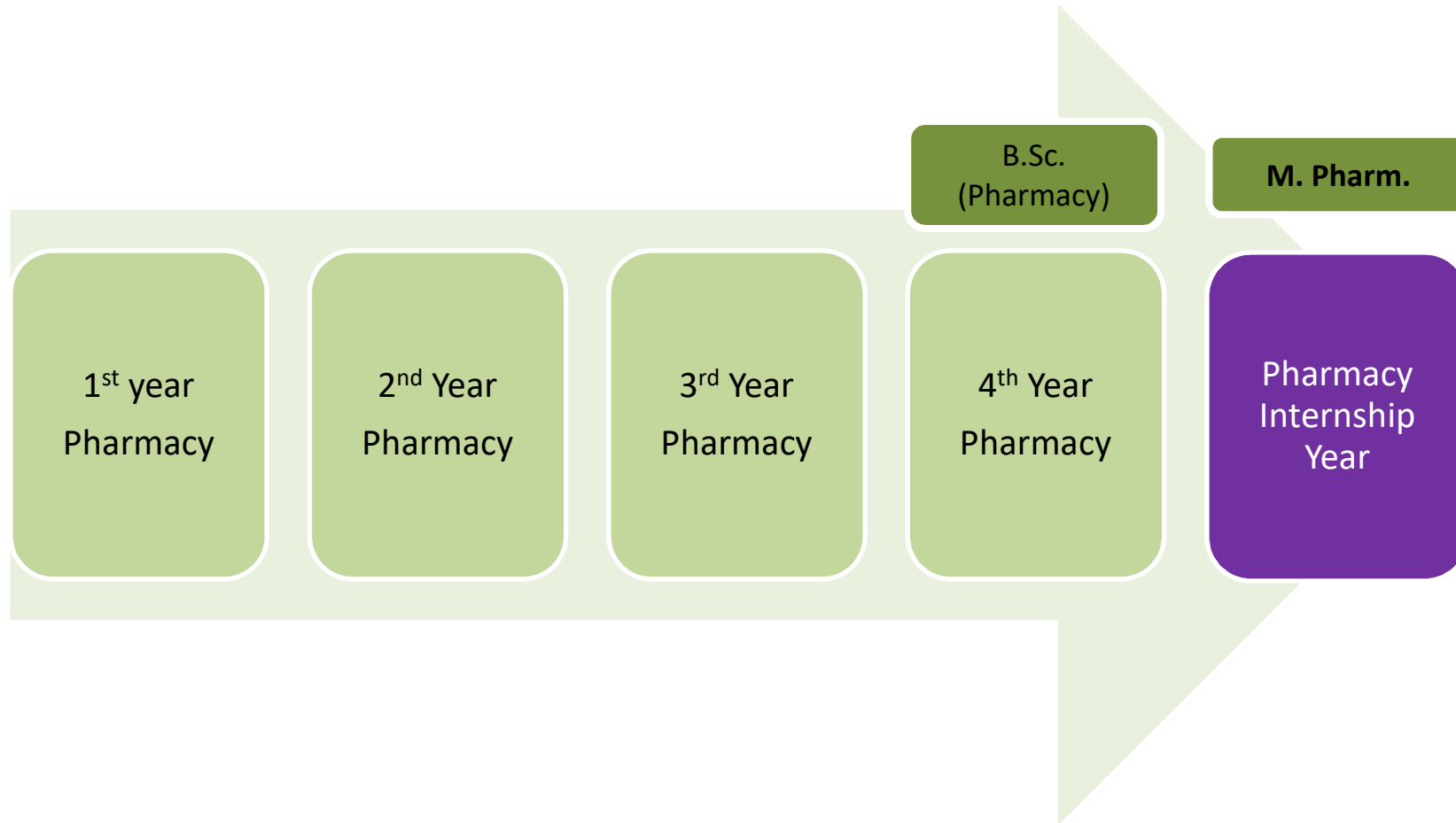

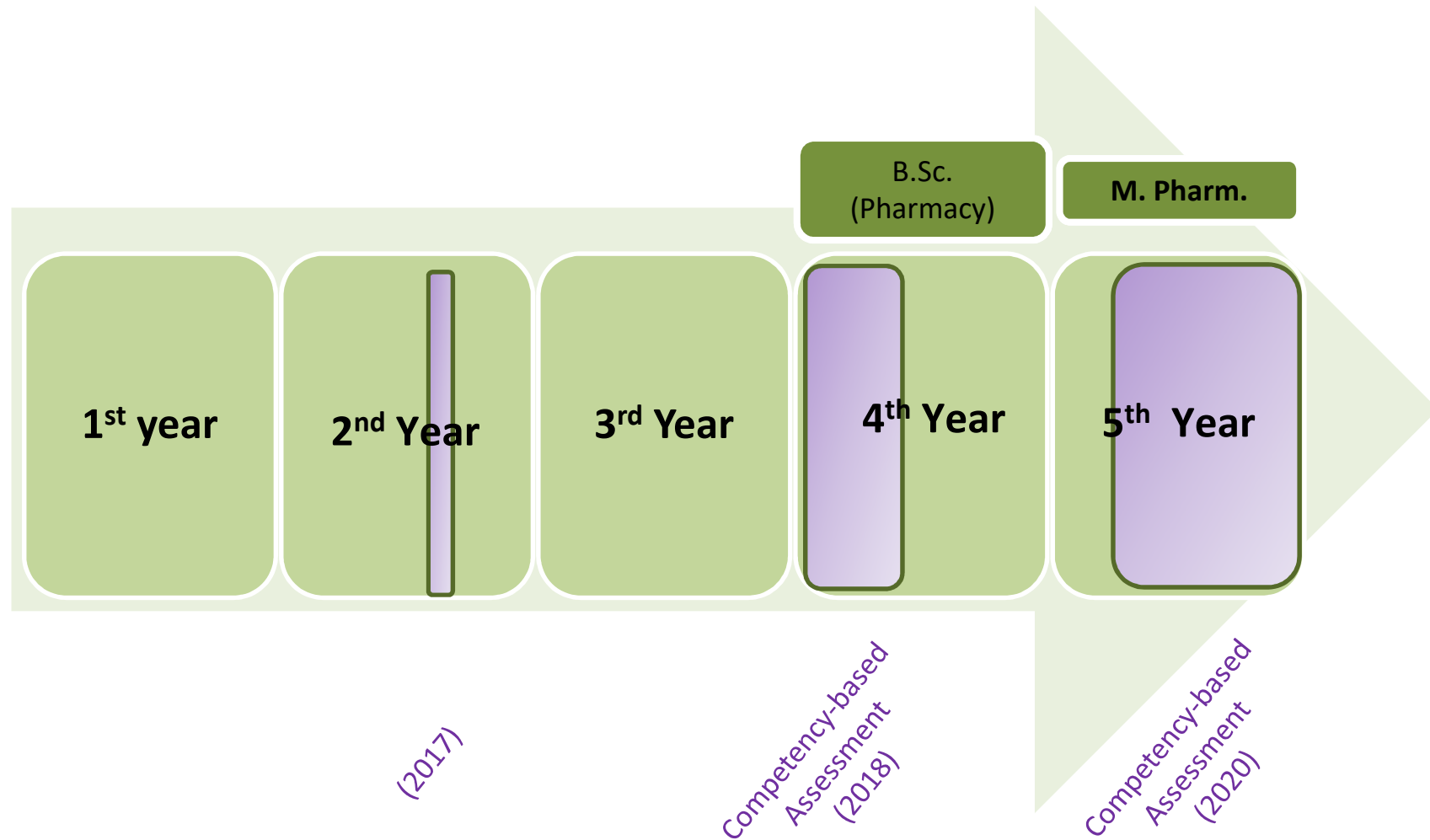


Ireland – Pharmacy Education pre-2015

Year 2 Placement: Activity 1

Following a prescription journey

- Presentation of prescription by patient
- Legal checking
- Calculation
- Patient Medication Record entry
- Assembling of medication
- Clinical check
- Risk management (personnel work-environment)
- Patient Monitoring / follow-up



Non-prescription supply

- Patient counselling
- Communication skills

Continued Professional Development (CPD) Cycle

- Action (describe an action undertaken)
- Document learning (what went well or did not go so well?)
- Evaluate impact on practice
- Self-appraisal (what would you do differently?)
- Develop personal plan (steps for further development)

Assessment by the School

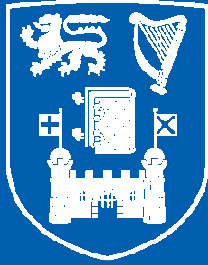
- e-Portfolio
